#### CURRICULUM NEWS

#### INTEGRATED LEARNING TOPIC FOR TERM 2 is "FOOD, GLORIOUS FOOD"

**ART** – Students from prep to year 6 unleashed their creativity in an engaging screen-printing art lesson. They learnt how to transfer their imaginative designs onto paper, discovering the artistry behind layering colours and patterns, to create stunning visual artworks.



**RESPECTFUL RELATIONSHIPS** - This Term, Ms Ritchie has commenced teaching Respectful Relationships with each class. This is done in conjunction with the classroom teacher. Our first topic is: Personal and Social Awareness. For Prep, this is looking at the emotions that we experience in different situations. Grade 1 and 2 are looking at emotional responses to safe and unsafe situations. Grade 3 and 4 are studying how stereotypes influence choice and behaviours. Grade 5 and 6 are looking at influences on our personal identity including people, popular culture and the media.

Prep - In Prep this term, we have started our procedural writing unit. The students have been so engaged and excited by our Food, Glorious Food unit as we are exploring recipes. So far, we have made apple donuts, fairy bread and fruit kebabs. Come and have a look at the notice board outside our classroom to see all of the wonderful photos of the preps cooking. Through exploring recipes, we are learning what procedural texts look like, their structure, how images have meaning and how to write simple instructions. We have been linking our English unit to our Health unit and discussing healthy foods. Students have been trying a variety of fruits and vegetables and talking about eating 5 serves of veggies and 2 serves of fruit a day. In Maths, we have been exploring sorting and patterning. Students have been sorting objects based

on common characteristics and looking at simple patterns.



Year 1/2 – Welcome back to another busy term! We welcome Murphy and his family to our class. In the Year 1/2 classroom, we are joining in with the school wide theme of 'Food, Glorious Food!'

**English:** Procedures. We will learn to write instructions, in particular for recipes, which align with our Food Theme. Last week we made jam sandwiches, this week was fruit kebabs. Yum!

**Maths:** Time – hour, half hour, quarter hour, calendars, time duration, Skip Counting.

**Science:** Changes in our environment - weather, day/night, seasons.

**History:** How families and daily life have changed over time.

**Health:** Healthy bodies – taking care of ourselves with healthy food and hygiene.

**Year 3/4** – This term, our class will go on a culinary journey utilising the FEAST program from Oz Harvest. We will explore food waste, healthy nutrition and the creation of procedures and recipes. Students will use their scientific knowledge of solids, liquids and gases to explore and classify different materials. We have commemorated special occasions like ANZAC Day and our 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary, and have learnt about the significance of these and other important celebrations. In Mathematics, students investigated place value and fractions and will be studying time, patterns, skip counting and addition, subtraction and multiplication

strategies. We are looking forward to an exciting and delicious term.

**Year 5/6** - **Literacy**- This term, we are focusing on procedural texts. We are participating in learning experiences from the Oz Harvest program deepening our knowledge and understanding of food wastage and sustainability. Every Friday we will be participating in a cooking lesson.

The senior students are also working towards a BBQ where they will be making and serving a food of their choice to their peers. This runs alongside our whole class rewards system that we currently have in place in our classroom.

**Maths**- We are currently covering a range of topics including: Number and Algebra with a primary focus on fractions, decimals and percentages.

Measurement and Geometry- With a primary focus on 24-hour time and timetables, mapping, ordered pairs and transformation.

Statistics and probability- with a focus on outcomes and frequency.

Science- we will be investigating states of matter, liquids, solids and gases and the transition between the different states.

We look forward to a successful term ahead.

Does your child feel overly fearful, anxious, or worried in certain situations?

Many children can feel anxious, fearful, or worried in certain situations. In most situations this is a normal emotion when faced with something threatening. Everyone can feel anxious from time to time. However, some children experience anxiety more intensely or more often than others and it stops them from having fun, going to school, or getting the most out of their life.

Take Action is an evidence-based program for 7- to 12-year-olds experiencing anxiety. Each child session takes approximately 1 hour, and the program runs over 10-12 weeks (either in-person or online). The program also includes six x 1-hour sessions for parents/carers to provide additional education and support on managing children's anxiety.

All children receive a comprehensive assessment before and after the program, and all child and parent/carer workbooks and materials to practice Take Action skills at home are provided. The project has full ethics approval from the Griffith University Human Research Ethics Committee (HREC: **2023/381**).
